SHPEP is a **FREE** six-week academic summer enrichment program for first-year and sophomore college students interested in the health professions, including:

- Dentistry
- Medicine
- Nursing
- Optometry
- Pharmacy
- Physical therapy
- Physician assistant
- Public health



## To be eligible for SHPEP, an applicant must:

- Be a first-year or sophomore college student.
- Have an overall GPA of 2.5.
- Be a U.S. citizen, a permanent resident, or an individual granted deferred action for childhood arrivals (DACA) status by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services.

## Other factors for consideration include that a student:

- Identifies with a group that is racially or ethnically underrepresented in the health professions.
- Comes from an economically or educationally disadvantaged background.
- Has demonstrated an interest in issues affecting underserved populations.
